OUR VISION AND MISSION

The vision of PTS College & Advanced Studies Inc. (formerly known as Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Inc.) is to be a leading Reformed Christian institution that proclaims the Gospel and ministers to the church, society, and God's creation. To achieve this vision, PTS -CAS aims to provide quality and holistic education at all levels; to train men and women for the building-up of the Christian church and transformation of the society where local church exists; and to serve as catalyst for the expansion of God's kingdom on earth.

THE PHD IN INTERCULTURAL STUDIES (PhD in ICS)

In partnership with Asia Graduate School of Theology (AGST), PTS-CAS is launching the Doctor of Philosophy in Intercultural Studies (PhD in ICS) program. PhD in ICS program is designed to be completed in 4 - 5 years. The goal is to provide post-graduate academic training to those called to Christian service in the local churches, academic institutions and mission organizations. As students grow in their understanding and passion for mission, they will be fully prepared to teach, research, and equip emerging church leaders particularly in Asian contexts. The Intercultural Studies concentration will position scholars with expertise in cross-cultural communication, cultural and urban mission.

GOAL AND OBJECTIVES

The PhD in Intercultural Studies (PhD in ICS) program is to provide academic training for the integration of research in mission and Christian service particularly aiming to equip Christian scholars who will do mission in the Philippines, Asia and beyond. The program will implement effective methods in academic research, consolidate observations, classification and analysis in order to produce quality research. The program integrates debate, dialogue and participation at international academic research in the fields of mission.

In order to achieve our goal, we commit ourselves to the following objectives:

- equipping students with the relevant knowledge, attitude, and skills to be effective social agents in transforming society through the gospel’s power
- develop critical awareness of the ways by which research in mission and theological reflection inform and enhance the practice of doing mission
- responding to issues identified in the field with timely, strategic and rigorous research
- nurturing spaces for the integration of both scholarship and practice
- ensuring the fruit of scholarship is accessible to reflective mission practitioners

METHODS OF DELIVERY

The PhD in Intercultural Studies aims to achieve the highest academic level of scholarship. Through the program, students will be guided to incorporate courses, seminars and mentoring to attain excellence in academic research, design and praxis. The structure of this program includes a rigorous organization and design of courses, seminars, field research and mentoring to enable the student to prepare and submit an original doctoral dissertation.

The PhD in Intercultural Studies is designed to be completed in 4-5 years to a maximum of 8 years. Extension could be granted after the review of students’ academic performance and written request. The PhD in ICS program is divided into *Four Phases*.

First phase of the program may be completed in residential study on campus, online, or hybrid. However, before starting the second semester, each student is assigned a mentor/advisor to discuss desired specialization within the degree program. Specialization is reflected in the choices of CORE courses and ELECTIVE courses.

Second Phase of the program, courses may be completed in residential study on campus, online or hybrid. At the end of the second phase, students are expected to complete twelve (9) units of Research Methodology and Field Research; twenty-four (24) units of CORE courses and twelve (12) units of ELECTIVE courses.

Third Phase of the program has two (2) parts:

Part 1: COMPREHENSIVE EXAMINATION

Every student is required to pass *two comprehensive exams*: 1) Missiological knowledge and 2) in-depth knowledge from directed study. Each student will be working individually with a mentor/advisor in preparation for the comprehensive examination. According to one's concentration, faculty shall prepare a comprehensive list of resources and questionnaires for the comprehensive examination. Comprehensive Examination is a PASS or FAIL.

Part II: DISSERTATION PROPOSAL AND WRITING

Each student has to present a *Dissertation Proposal* before a Dissertation Committee. The committee shall consist of 2-3 mission faculty professors. Upon passing, the Dissertation Committee shall recommend to certify a student as PhD in ICS candidate.

Last Phase of the Program is **DISSERTATION WRITING AND DEFENSE.**

Each student who is writing a dissertation should follow the prescribed PTS-CAS/AGTS standard of writing. A student who is writing a dissertation is expected to meet with his/her mentor/advisor regularly. Mentor shall serve as **first reader**. The Mission Department shall select **second reader** and **third/outside reader** as core members of the Dissertation Committee. Mentor and two (2) readers' are to sign the APPROVAL PAGE and counter signed by the Director of Mission Department and Academic Dean.

In collaboration with the mentor/advisor, the student shall request the Director of Mission Department for Dissertation Defense schedule at least three (3) months before the anticipated graduation. **Only when** the dissertation committee accepted and approved the candidate's dissertation, **approval page signed** and **final copies** submitted to the Mission Department program office, only then the committee certifies the degree Ph. D. in Intercultural Studies to the candidate. The Mission Department shall then arrange a presentation of the dissertation to the public.

DISSERTATION WRITING GUIDELINES

Dissertation should be around 75,000 words, at least 30% of resources are regional writers. According to specific research interests of the students under the guidance of a mentor, dissertation shall consist of scholarship, biblical and theological foundations of analysis and interpretation, and implications that may lead to praxis. CURRICULUM

The curriculum of the PhD in ICS follows a semester academic structure. One (1) semester unit is equivalent to fifteen (15) hours of instruction either in person or online. One instruction hour is 50 minutes. Example: A Five (5) day- intensive class of 8 hours each day is equivalent to three (3) semester units with supplemental pre-class readings.

In order to graduate with the degree PhD in ICS, students are required to complete a total of fifty-seven (57) semester-hours curriculum. The curriculum is comprised of the following:

In consultation with his/her mentor/advisor, student is required to complete eight (8) CORE courses. Each core course is equivalent to three (3) semester hours. Completion of CORE courses is a prerequisite to writing a dissertation proposal.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Total 12 units

Student may customize his/her elective courses curriculum in order to broaden his/her expertise. Student is required to complete a minimum of four (4) 3-unit elective courses.

DISSERTATION

Total 12 units

Writing dissertation and defense are equivalent to twelve (12) semester units.

Course Grading Policy Statements.

A clear statement of the grading policy must be included in each course syllabus offered by the seminary. Grade policy statements should include:

- the criteria by which the grade will be assigned, such as the weight of assignments, examinations, and other factors
- whether a student whose work is not completed at the end of the semester may receive an Incomplete, a reduction in grade or an F (Fail) grade
- a statement of the deadline for completion or whether a reduction of grade or a grade of F will be given if work is not completed and turned in at the end of the Incomplete period. (Incomplete grades should be removed at the end of the next semester).

Grade Reports

Grades for a semester are submitted to and recorded by the Registrar's Office by the end of the week after the semester examination ends.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The PhD in ICS program is geared towards cross-cultural missionaries, pastors who are doing mission work here and abroad and to those who are preparing to be actively involved in Christian mission.

3. Academic Requirements and Official Transcript of Records

- Submit undergraduate and graduate transcripts from accredited institutions.
- Evidence of obtaining Master's degree (Master of Divinity) from an accredited institution with grade point average of 1.5 or higher (1.00 as the highest); or
- Successful completion of at least 60 semester units of graduate-level course work of a theological studies that includes 15 semester credits of missiological coursework (preferred courses - Mission Theology, Global History of Christianity & Cultural Anthropology)

4. Christian Conversion and Ministry Experience

An autobiography describing the applicant's personal background, Christian experience, and reason for applying to this school.

5. English Proficiency Requirements (English Program)

EPE Score of 500:

In order to comply with the PTS-CAS/AGST language requirement, applicants are required to take the English Proficiency Examination (EPE). An EPE score of 500 is the minimum requirement for admission to PTS-CAS/AGST's doctoral program. TOEFL or other internationally recognized English examination passers are not required to take EPE.

Sample paper written in English (except Korean language program):

For admission, submit a ten (10) -page sample essay or previous class term paper demonstrating research and writing abilities
